2021 Driving Events

On January 14, 2021, a few members met via Zoom conference call to discuss potential driving events for the 2021 season. **Participants**: Greg and Suzanne Willodson, Rich and Liz Stradther, Dan Powell, and John Hatzung.

Current events for dedicated vintage racing at Road America are mid-May, mid-July and mid-September. Amery has been held at the end of June and August (until the last few years), plus interspersed Vintage Sports Car Racing (VSCR) events.

What kind of events will our insurance allow? No wheel-to-wheel, speed runs or hill climbs. (Waumandee is now a time trial). Minimum helmet standards discourage providing lenders. Would that apply to riders? Rallies are a possibility. We should consult with Clarence Westerberg about this kind of event.

Autocrosses are allowed with a rider. Dave Hatzung can verify this and the cost of the rider. This impacts Amery. Considering the number of newer, high-powered cars, it's hard to anticipate the level of participation without the speed run. Amery runs charge \$500 per event.

COVID remains a concern, especially for the first half of summer, so Amery might be iffy depending on the level of infections and vaccinations.

The addition of an event at the Dakota County Technical College track is attractive and might allow a wider range of driving opportunities and layouts – either a track day or autocross. John will inquire about dates in the latter half of summer. Rich suggested talking to Mike (?) at VSCR – possibly about adding a tech component among other activities that would attract vintage car owners who enjoy driving in a spirited way.

Action items:

- Dave Hatzung will review insurance details and costs noted above.
- John will call VSCR and Clarence to talk about track and rally events.
- John will contact Jim Unger at DCTC about track availability.

Todd Bjerknes needs a new kidney

You may know Todd because he organizes the Intermargue Breakfast. He used to drive a Morris Minor wood-paneled Traveler, and now he owns a blue right-hand drive Mini Cooper.

"For the last ten years I have been living with chronic kidney disease (CKD)."

At this point I'm living a normal active life. For the most part I feel fine, even though my doctors say I'm not fine. I'm needing a kidney transplant, I need to let my friends, family and associates know about my condition.

Currently my kidneys are working at about 16 to 20% of normal kidneys. My doctors at the University of Minnesota are saying that I will be needing dialysis or a kidney transplant sooner than later. Thank goodness, I'm not at that point yet. I was recently placed on the active waiting list for a deceased donor kidney, however, that wait time is generally about four to five years, with about 125,000 on the national waiting list. When a living kidney is transplanted, long-term success is more likely to be attained.

Here's some basic information about kidney donations:

- We are born with an extra kidney. You only need one to live a full, heathy life. •
- The majority of the donor surgery is laparoscopically, with tiny incisions.
- The recuperation period is generally 2 weeks for those with a desk job and 6 weeks for those • whose job entails heavy lifting.
- The surgery will be done at the University of Minnesota with the best care in the country. •
- All medical expenses will be paid by my insurance benefits.
- Most donors say that if they had another extra kidney they would donate again, and that it is • one of the best experiences of their life.

If you or someone you know would be willing to make this type of commitment, please visit the website <u>umnhealthlivingdonnor.org</u> to begin the kidney donation process. Or if you would like to explore this in more detail before you make your decision, you can call the living donor office at 612-625-7010. You can let them know your interests without disclosing my name at that point.

Thanks for considering this endeavor and if you should decline, I certainly understand.
