

He'd done a nice job on both the blue bodywork and the green engine, which sported a new fresh coat or two of Austin Green Engine Enamel.

We took the engine off the stand, forced the transmission into the car, hooked up the driveshaft and then mated the engine up to the tranny. This was the first time I'd seen this technique on a Spridget. I'd always installed the engine and tranny together in one clumsy motion. This worked about as well, with the aid of a few blocks of wood, jacks, big mallets, a wrecking prybar and the lift. We were able to wrangle the (soon-to-be) snarling beast back into its corral. It seems that every time I install an engine, or assist with it, I come away with one distilled underlying thought: Gravity can work WITH you, and gravity can work AGAINST you. A little of *my* blood was shed as we were struggling against gravity to push the transmission back into its den, but gravity soon came to the rescue as the transmission rocked back downward freeing my index finger - which had become firmly sandwiched between the bell housing and the battery box. It wouldn't be a Healey Tech session unless at least one of us contributed some hemoglobin to the effort, and I was happy to make the contribution - as I'll soon see Wayne and Jan cruising down the road this summer.

We took a break with the engine/tranny bolted in place and retired to the cabin for some ham sandwiches and tales of deer hunting with rifles and chasing away Jehovah's Witnesses and burglars alike with various muskets and chainsaws. I left as they went back out to the shop to hook up the ancillaries. Wayne: NICE cabin! What a treat to see it. Thanks for sharing! We'll see you on the road soon.

Trip #3: February 2009

Early in February **Jeff Lumbard**, our racing buddy **Brian Crombie** (former owner of a concour BJ-8, current owner of an MGBGTV8), and I set off on our third journey across the pond to visit car museums and other venues older than we are... which is getting tougher to find as the years go by. This trip centered around Retromobile in Paris followed by a Chunnel trip to the Dover area, where we picked up a car and eventually flew home from Birmingham England.

This trip had been in the planning stages for over two years. Brian grew up in Canada, so he had enough knowledge of French that we weren't overtly insulted while in Paris (as far as we knew)! Actually the French we met were friendly... of course that could have been because we were spending lots of Euros.

We arrived at our hotel in on Saturday about 11:00 AM local time and went sightseeing. This was my second trip to Paris so I was the guide. I showed them Norte Dame in a snowstorm and the lower half of Eiffel Tower in freezing rain... a lovely time was had by all! Sunday we went to Retromobile and met up with another racing buddy - Grant Gongell (bugeye driver in the AUHC, lives in Memphis), who is a pilot for FedEx and at the last minute was able to arrange his schedule to join us for the middle portion of our adventure. The Metro ride across Paris was like a rough-edged London tube, but it got us there. The Retromobile Show wasn't as big as in some past years, the economy hitting everything it seems; but most of the "cream" was on display. We saw (close enough to touch) the never restored Bugatti that had been in storage since 1960 or 61. It had sold the night before for about \$5,000,000 USD. The Hispano-Suizas took your breath away as did the price of lunch (captive audience). Jeff bought a new Healey book from the French A-H club and had the author sign it. He also bought a toy for his race Healey that I will give him the chance to describe later... except to say I thought we should hire a guard to take us back to the hotel. We saw lots of other interesting cars and also visited with Paul Nesse who was displaying his art.

Monday we took the Chunnel train to England and picked up a rental car. Brian drove (I drove on our first trip to England and was immediately "promoted" to navigator for the next two trips... don't know why?). Had a chance to really use my TomTom930 with euro maps... it worked very well, but you still want a fairly detailed map as a backup. We went to Dover Castle and toured the labyrinth of war tunnels that had been cut into the chalk under the castle and the ancient fortifications (30 MPH wind off the channel with spitting rain... lovely). Prior to dinner we attended evensong at Canterbury Cathedral. If you ever have the chance to attend an evensong, jump at it. You sit in the choir on chairs or benches that have been used for hundreds of years, watching the church come alive with the ritual and music. We stayed at a pub B&B about eight miles from Canterbury called The Three Tuns, which was first mentioned in print in the 1100's. No, there wasn't central heating, but the beverages tasted fine sitting in front of the open hearth fireplaces in the public room. The local MG club had their monthly meeting that night, so we had a chance to try to convert them to Healeyism!

Tuesday was off to Beaulieu, the home of the National Motor Museum. Our route took us about three miles from Brooklands; so we made a quick detour, looked at the cars, walked up the banking, and had lunch there. This was our third visit to Brooklands, and it was interesting to see the changes made each time - as well as the progress being made on the airplane restorations that were ongoing since our first visit in 2003. Trip #3: February 2009 continued

Wednesday was busy... lots of driving with several scheduled stops. After breakfast it was off to the Aston Martin restoration facility in Newport Pagnell. This was our third visit to an Aston Martin venue. 2003 was the Vanquish factory – those buildings have now been demolished for a housing development. 2006 was the DB9 factory at Gaydon, and this year was the restoration facility. We saw a Lagonda (extreme wedge shape with spaceship style instruments) that was in for a 700,000 pound (not dollar) restoration! We were also shown two DB5's - "Bond 1" and "Bond 2" - documented cars from the movie Goldfinger that were in for restoration. Our next stop apparently didn't want to be found, so we headed off for the Bugatti Trust, which is in Prescott (a little town in the Cotswolds which also has a major hillclimb venue... go figure!). On the way, fate intervened. At an intersection of two "B" roads, we saw a signpost pointing left toward the Hook Norton Brewery. At the same intersection, a chap was offloading Hook Norton beer from a truck. Obviously we turned left. They have been brewing beer in the same buildings for over 160 years. We had a mini-tour of the brewery and sampled just enough of their brew to keep it safe but mellow in the car. We arrived at the Bugatti Trust about five minutes before closing, but the gentleman there spent about an hour with us discussing everything known about the man and the car. They have two Bugatti's on display as well as engines, drawings, etc. Very interesting stuff. Jeff brought some 8x10 photos he had taken of the Bugatti airplane at the Oshkosh museum, and they were thrilled to get them. Then off to Yoxall, the home of Denis Welch and the finest pub B&B ever - The Golden Cup! Suitable beverages and meat pies capped off the long day of driving.

Thursday started out at Denis Welch's. Here we saw the endurance car they built, as well as their new dyno, and a number of other cars. After Jeff set the balance of payments totally in favor of the Brits, it was off to the Donington museum. There are more F-1 cars here in one place than anywhere else on earth. The owner, Mr. Wheatcroft, couldn't buy a Bugatti Royale, so he had an exact copy made!

Friday started out at Cape International - which although they do excellent restoration work, isn't as polished a location as their ads imply. We did see, however, the 11th Austin Healey ever made as well as a real C-type being restored (must be lots of money in England these days). Then off to the Jaguar Trust museum, where we saw the only one of these, the first or last of that, etc... kind of like being a diabetic in a chocolate shop. The only disturbing aspect of this venue was the sight of 94 acres of plowed land... all of which used to comprise the Brown's Lane Jaguar manufacturing facility... all those skilled jobs gone forever! Our last stop was the Coventry Motor Museum, which had a very long list of "former" auto manufacturers from the Coventry area... Darwin meets the British auto executive! That evening, prior to dinner, we ran into two Dutch Healey enthusiasts in the pub. Rinus Sinke (and his rally navigator Peter), who had, along with a chase car, driven his Healey seven hours from Holland to drop it off at Denis Welch "to have the engine looked at". Turned out he is the president of the Dutch AH club and heavy into racing (see www.healeymeetslemans.nl). They were driving somewhere in the area to meet Jeremy Welch for dinner, and we were happy to see them at breakfast the next morning - as Brian had kept their wine glasses full throughout our hour long visit. One last meat pie for dinner and then the trip was over.

Saturday was the marathon flying day.... Birmingham to Amsterdam to Detroit to Minneapolis. Good to be home... already talking about the next trip in three years.


