- 2. 9:15am at Bogus Creek Café and Bakery, N2049 Spring Street, Stockholm, WI. From 494, it's a scenic 50-minute drive to Stockholm. Take Hwys 10 and 61 south and east out of the Twin Cities. Turn left to stay on 10 East, heading toward Prescott. Cross over the drawbridge in Prescott and turn right onto Wisconsin Hwy 35 South. Pass through Diamond Bluff, cross Hwy 63, go through Bay City and Maiden Rock. In beautiful downtown Stockholm, turn left onto County J. Bogus Creek is one block up on your left. We will be having a fabulous breakfast at Bogus Creek, served by the lovely and talented proprietor, Colleen.

GYMKHANA VI INVITATIONAL

Once again a good time was had by all at the 6th annual Brown & Bigelow Gymkhana Invitational. This year we hoped to attract a majority of vintage cars and make this driving event an invitational to other clubs. We had 18 cars attend, predominantly (2/3) vintage and truely intermarque; 3 Austin-Healeys, 1 Jensen Healey, 3 Lotuses, TVR, Mini, Triumph, MG, Citroen with a modern Toyota, Mitsubishi, Mazda, MG, Mini, and Volkswagen.

Thanks to everyone for attending, and all the help. With everyone pitching in things ran smoothly all day. The weather cooperated as well, with partly sunny to sunny conditions all day. Paul Weidner designed an excellent course which proved to be a good test for all. 4 drivers had their best times in their first run. 4 drivers had their best times in their last run. Everyone else seemed to peak on their 2nd or 3rd run. Drivers all did nearly as many runs as they would like (some up to 7 and 8 runs).

There was lots of good driving and as always, a chance to "get loose" for the crowd. Steve Rixen wowed everyone with a big slide in the middle of the course, and Aaron Courteau's lotus spun nearly 360 as well. The "pin" cone in the center of the course layout created much debate as to the quickest strategy (options: either clockwise traditional route or the counter-clockwise pretzel move). Over the day, the course began to get slippery and very few times improved.

Afterwards a group of 20 or so went over to George's on Plato for late lunch and beverages. Tom Hazen shared great video from the day including much in-car footage. I shared the results of the day, and distributed the fastest time of day certificates to all drivers.


