There were 180+ Healeys lined up in front of the historical buildings along Main Street Galena. This was the first time they had actually closed the entire street to auto traffic and the sight was truly incredible. Weather-wise – it was cool and overcast, with a look of rain that never developed. Just perfect. Minnesota had some nicely restored entries.

On Tuesday the extremely competitive gymkhana was held at the area high school parking lot. Steve Rixen turned in a blazing 47.9 seconds, which was the fastest time of any car on this day. Tom Politiski snatched a trophy in his Jensen demonstrating its capabilities. Two of the gals captured 2nd and 3rd places in the women's group – Kim Rixen and Eileen Wetzel respectively. 












Conclave 2010 - Epísode
