### **Directions to Herreid Cabin SHORTCUT**

1. I-94 East toward Wisconsin.
2. Manning Road exit and turn right (south).
3. Go straight at the stop sign on 40<sup>th</sup> Street.
4. Turn left on 50<sup>th</sup> street. Cross three roads, including Neal Road, Trading Post Road, and St. Croix Street (County 21). Keep going on 50<sup>th</sup>. After crossing County 21, 50<sup>th</sup> rises steeply. Afton State Park will be on your right.
5. Take a right onto Quadrant.
6. Go to step 9.

### **LONG WAY through Afton**

1. I-94 East toward Wisconsin.
2. Take the Stillwater/Lakeland exit (the last one before the bridge over the St. Croix River).
3. Take a right (south) through Lakeland, including 3 roundabouts.
4. Keep going straight ahead through Afton.
5. At the south edge of Afton you'll come to a Y intersection. From now on you'll take all the left turns.
6. Go left onto River Road (not right onto 21).

7. The road goes along the river, and then turns right and goes up the hill.
8. When you come to the top of the hill, take the left turn onto Quadrant.
9. At the locked gate to the State Park, the road turns left and becomes Swede Hill Dr.
10. Swede Hill Dr winds around. Keep going past the increasingly shrill signs saying Dead End, Turn Around Now, etc.
11. At the end of the main road you'll come to a house overlooking the river on the top of the cliff. A private drive on the right says Back Acres, and an unmarked private drive is on the right. Past the unmarked drive is one on the left numbered 16530, with a sign "Herreids." Take the left onto this private drive.
12. When you get to the bottom of the hill, the cabin is on the left. It's okay to park by the cabin or in the turnaround as long as you don't block the asphalt road past the turnaround.




