### TECH TIP: by Ernie West Out Of Sight Out Of Mind

That's kind of like forgetting your anniversary or your wife's birthday. The penalty can be severe. It's like the little things that don't have any "flashing red light" that still can cause you a lot of grief. So it's up to you to <u>look</u> for them and give them the attention they need. In years past, cars came with a maintenance book that spelled out every conceivable thing that needed service based on either or both time and mileage.

With my wife's new car there is practically nothing to do for 100,000 miles except change the oil and filter, and rotate the tires every 6,000 miles.

Apply that to your 39 Packard, 55 Chev, MGA, Jaguar E-Type, or Triumph and you'll be walking more than driving.

On a recent 160 mile trip to Fargo, ND. In our Jaguar powered 46 International pick-up, we enjoyed the first half at the normal 70 MPH plus five speed. But on our way back that slowly diminished to 55 MPH or so. The reason: A fuel filter that hadn't been changed for 14 years. Out of sight, out of mind.

If you own and drive an older collector vehicle, do yourself a favor and get out the handbook, call a mechanic that's familiar with your car, or go on-line and find out what the maintenance schedule and list is for your car. You'll be surprised at what needs attention and how often. These vintage cars had lube points and fluid levels everywhere. Some possible areas are: rear axle bearings, u-joints, spring shackles, king pins, tie rod ends, drag links, idler arms, shock links, brake cables, speedo and tach cables, generators, distributors, water pumps, door hinges and latches, brake and clutch linkage or pivots, starter bushings, carb dashpots, etc. Then there's all those fluid levels: transmission, rear end, brake and clutch fluids, steering sector, some idler arms, radiator, and some shock absorber reservoirs. Then there are the adjustments: Distributor dwell, ignition timing, belt adjustments, clutch adjustment, brake shoe adjustment, and throw in the multitude of carb adjustments like, hot idle speed, fast idle speed, choke mixture, choke pull off setting, hot idle mixture, float level, and throttle let down dash pot. And don't forget the fuel and air filters.

At this point, let me ask you. Are you sure you wished they built cars today like they did in the "good old days"?

Me neither.


