AHCA Ponders Biennial Membership Directory

Dues the Same for 2012

There will be no national dues increase for 2012. Other highlights of the Nov. 11-13 national delegates meeting in Louisville were:

With an eye on reducing costs and forestalling further dues increases, delegates voted to publish the national directory every-other year and then rescinded that vote. It was felt that before changing the publication's frequency all delegates should poll their memberships about the idea. After Healey Marque, the directory is the largest expense item in the national budget. It currently costs between \$14,000-\$15,000 annually, and with another postage increase expected in 2012 it could top that figure.

The vote to change the publication frequency was made conditional on the AHCA Web site giving all members electronic access to an update of new members in the years a book is not published. There was some concern that such Web site access would not be available to members by 2013, the year after publishing the 2012 directory. So, this is your chance to let me know what you think about such a change in directory publication. Shoot me an e-mail at glauser@centurylink.net with any input you want to share.

Delegates also heard and rejected a proposal from the Gateway AHC delegate that the structure of AHCA be changed. He proposed combining the 46 regional and specialty clubs into nine districts. Discussion concluded that while there might be minimal budgetary savings, maintaining AHCA clubs' distinctive one-club, one-vote delegate representation was preferable and a national club feature of AHCA be changed. Let me know if you feel consolidation of delegates is needed.

A way to help hold dues steady is for members to recommend a parts or services supplier to Angie's List, which at this point has been under-utilized by local clubs. Go to: https://www.angieslist.com/AngiesList/review/charitablereports.aspx and enter Austin-Healey Club or America as the charity. Angie's List will donate \$5 to AHCA for each valid report. You'll be asked for your own and the supplier's contact information, like you'd find on a business card.

National officers remain the same. Long-time national officer and past president Bob Gilleland will be stepping down as advertising director for Healey Marque. If you want to throw your hat in the ring to solicit advertising for the magazine, contact President Gary Brierton of the Triad Club in Winston-Salem, N.C.

The Conclave Colorado 2011 group contributed its total profit of \$9,500 to AHCA. That's because AHCA officers planned and hosted the event, with able assistance from several regional clubs. Conclave 2012 is slated for June 17-21 in Louisville, Ky.; with Conclave 2013 set June 23-28 at a castle in Charlevoix, a northeastern Quebec resort area about 5 hours northeast of Montreal and two hours north of Quebec City. It is a Fairmont resort named Le Manoir Richelieu and I have a brochure about it if you wish to see it. Conclave 2014 is tentatively set in the Southeast U.S., but since there has been no formal proposal made yet an exact location isn't available now.

All vintage car clubs continue fighting two trends: decreasing membership and increasing costs. National membership was 3,065 in early November, down from 3,195 last year at the same time. Currently, annual turnover rate in membership is about 500 non-renewals while adding 400 new members. Overall, membership is down some 13 percent in the past four years.



Cooling Tech Tip

Ethylene Glycol is the most popular chemical used to keep your engine block and cooling system from turning into an (cracked) ice cube in winter. It comes in green or red and it carries chemical additives which aid in preventing rust and corrosion year round.

Unfortunately for our pets and kids it also has a 'sweet' taste which is found attractive to the unwary and can be ingested in a quantity which will cause injury, long term organ damage or death.

Propylene glycol anti-freeze is also available which is no less injurious to living things but it does not have the attractive sweet taste of ethylene glycol. Prestone Lo-Tox is the one brand name I could find available, carried by some O'Reilly Auto Parts stores. My local store ordered a case, of which I purchased a number of gallons.

A 50/50 mix of concentrated antifreeze and water, (distilled is best) will give -34° F freeze protection for Ethelyne and -32° for Propylene. If you decide to use a Low Tox type of anti-freeze, you will need to also update your tester to one made for propylene. The picture is of a propylene tester (green bulb). If it were a ethylene version it would have a black bulb.

Modern antifreeze serves another function in that it inhibits corrosion of steel and aluminum parts by having what is termed 'reserve alkalinity' (RA). Test strips which test the amount of 'reserve alkalinity' are available at your local auto parts store or can be found at website like Amazon.com in various quantities. By dipping these strips in your radiator fluid you will find a pad portion of the strip changes colors. One of the strips colors will tell if your antifreeze has sufficient RA to protect your engine from corrosion. The strips also have a pad which will tell the freeze protection level. Level of protection is indicated by comparing the color of the pad with a color chart provided.

If your antifreeze no longer has the freeze protection or reserve alkalinity to protect your engine, or if your fluid is full of rust and looks bad you may need to flush your cooling system. This can be done in your driveway or done at your local oil change business for a reasonable price where your fluid should be removed, filtered, chemically adjusted for RA and freeze protection and returned to your system. (Precision Tune advertises for \$49.90.) If you choose to do it in your driveway, there are some videos in YouTube on flushing and reverse flushing your engine, radiator and heater core at: http://www.youtube.com/

If you do it in your driveway you will have some old antifreeze to dispose. Minnesota Pollution Control Agency guidelines are available as a PDF file at their website at:

http://www.pca.state.mn.us/index.php/view-document.html?gid=4057 which state small quantities may be disposed of through sanitary sewer systems which will be able to filter and dilute it. The document also has a list of business which re-cycle antifreeze.


