



Tech Tip: by Doctor Ernie Subject: Silicone Glue In Place Of Gaskets

First off I'd like to dispel a myth. Many times this feature is started with the moniker "Doctor Ernie". Maybe this is some fantasy that my wife has. While I fancy that I could do the first part of the heart transplant, ok I'd probably not pull off the second part too well. So if your engine sputters, I'll bet I'd be able to save it; but if your aorta blows, you'd be better off dialing 911.

As long as I'm in the disclaimer mode, let me say that this is my own idea. It's a product of lots of years of trial and error (some people call this experience), and you yourself are the judge in deciding to use these ideas on your own kazillion dollar cars.

The subject is Silicone Glue In Place Of Gaskets. My preference of silicone sealer is Permatex Ultra Black. It seems to fit the requirements of most automotive repairs that I do. This isn't my invention. New cars have been adopting this idea for years now. I'm simply applying the same idea to older cars. GM, as well as other car makers, has been using a rather large bead of silicone glue around the tin and cast valve covers (instead of cork type gaskets), and it works very well. Many cars don't use one gasket in their trans axle units, and I'd dare to say they are the dry ones.

At the other end of the spectrum are the early British cars. They delighted in the use of every conceivable cork, paper, copper, aluminum, and even wood gaskets. And of course they enjoy the title of the most leaky cars in the world! There are some limits as to silicone use. Some that come to mind are related to gasoline, brake fluid, and space shuttle tiles (read the instructions); but most low-pressure lubricant and coolant sealing situations can be handled with just silicone glue instead of a gasket.

A prime example of the use of a far superior seal is to throw away the paper valve cover gasket on any E-Type Jaguar engine. Then just use a 1/16th inch bead all the way around the top, bottom, and front, and a 1/4th inch bead around the O-Ring area at the back end. Wipe off any excess that is squeezed out immediately. I even stipple a little coating of silicone on each side of each copper washer or under each screw head.

One time I even filled in a quarter size hole with silicone that a broken timing chain had punched through the timing cover of a 240-Z Datsun. That was only a temporary fix that the customer ignored repairing for over a year, because it didn't leak a drop. What I'm getting at, is if it (Silicone Glue) can seal a one inch hole, it certainly can seal a tiny gap.

The keyword to success is to have all the surfaces clean and dry (I use Brake Clean). Then allow adequate time for the silicone to dry. Thick applications require overnight drying.

Don't use silicone glue in high pressure applications (brakes, power-steering, air-conditioning, etc.) or areas that would be sensitive to a loose piece that would plug critical passages (automatic transmissions, carburetors, etc.).

Again, read the instructions and limitations that come with the product. One last thing - some gaskets actually are used as shims, and may have multiple layers. Silicone glue can't satisfy this requirement.
