## **Technical Tip - Torque Number 1**

This is one of, well, how many I am not sure, but this is the first article that will be concerned with good torque practices. In later articles I will talk more in depth about fastener grades & types, torque wrench types and proper use.

A torque table, which appears immediately below, is suitable for clipping, enlarging as desired or required by aged eyes, and attaching to a handy surface in your shop. Use the Torque Table to ascertain the appropriate torque to apply if the fastener you are installing does not appear in the Torque Specifications of your Bentley Austin-Healey Repair Manual.

The torques identified here are for the appropriate **thread and grade** of nuts torqued onto similarly graded bolts or studs. Good Torque practice requires the fastener threads to be clean and if possible lightly lubricated. If you don't know the shank diameter, invest in a low buck vernier or dial caliper and measure the diameter of the fastener shank.

If the fastener is a bolt being torqued into a threaded hole the there will be additional friction which will require additional torque be applied. Additional thread engagement and shank interference will require a percentage of additional torque be applied. (You judge if no information is available in the torque specs.)

The typical fastener on an Austin-Healey or MG is fine thread or UNF. (Triumphs are about the only British car which normally uses course threads in any quantity. Figures doesn't it?) British Standard or Whitworth fasteners have shank sizes close to those above and threads which are close to fine thread, British Standard Fine or BSF and should be torqued to nearly those above.

Grade 5 should be the assumed grade for the typical original British bolt. If your bolt has been replaced, it will be a grade 0 to 2 if it has no marks on it. If the head of the bolt has 3 lines, (usually equally spaced around the bolt 120 degrees between lines) it is a grade 5 and if it has eight lines it will be a grade 8. More Torque next time.

## List Favorite Suppliers & Automotive Specialists on Angie's List

Minnesota Austin-Healey Club members who want to help the Austin-Healey Club of America avoid another national dues increase soon, may do so by taking a few moments to list their favorite classic sports car suppliers and mechanical consultants on Angie's List.

Angie's List is starting a new Classic Cars initiative and seeks input from clubs around the country that can be recommended to those who consult Angie's List for recommendations. Each verified report can earn \$5 for the Austin-Healey Club of America if you designate it as your charity. Those who already have done so, say it takes about 3-5 minutes to complete a report and receive verification that the charity they designated will receive \$5 per report. You may provide more than one report, and each one verified earns AHCA \$5. Here's how to do it.

1. Go to https://www.angieslist.com/AngiesList/review/charitablereports.aspx

It is very simple to submit a report. There are big buttons that say "continue" and lots of prompts if you leave anything out.

- 2. When you click on the link above, you'll be prompted to set up a profile, including a password. Angie's List does not accept anonymous reports and requires a valid email address as part of the reporting process.
- 3. Select or type in Austin Healey Club of America when it asks for a charitable organization and follow the instructions.
- 4. Next, you'll be asked for a provider name. It is very likely that your providers are not on the List yet, so you can click "add" to add a provider.
- 5. When you add a provider, you'll be asked for their contact information. There are a few required fields here...like the kind of information you'd find on a business card. You'll be asked to choose some categories for the service provider (i.e. alternators, painting, etc.)
- 6. You'll next be taken to the report page, where you're asked to give grades via radio buttons and you're able to write comments about your experience.
- 7. Click submit. This will prompt an email to be sent to the email address you entered before. Your report will not be submitted until you verify your email address.

Once you verify your address, the report will be submitted and you can leave another report. This may seem like a lot of steps, but it's pretty quick...and once you've submitted your first report, it's very easy to go back and do more!

For those who don't use Garmins or TomToms, here are some directions:

## From I-94 in Hudson:

Take Exit 2 (Carmichael Road) at the top of the hill up from the St. Croix River and turn right at the stoplight. Carmichael Road becomes County Road F. Follow it south for approximately 11 miles to Pierce County Road MM. There is a St. Croix County Road MM about 4 miles south of Hudson, but don't be fooled and continue south on County Road F. (We mentioned you'd need your thinking cap, didn't we?)

On Pierce County Road MM, turn left for about four blocks, then turn right onto 1230<sup>th</sup> Street (You'll see a sign for Highlands Golf Course where you turn onto 1230<sup>th</sup>). Two blocks later turn right onto 694<sup>th</sup> Ave. (just past the mailboxes). Greg & Nancy can be found at the third house on the left. Be careful because 694<sup>th</sup> is a one-lane road and the drifts are plenty. Nearby parking will be at a premium, so carpool if you can.

## From I-494 at the Wacouta Bridge:

Take U.S. 61/U.S. 10 south toward Hastings approximately 15 miles. At stoplight just north of Hastings (there will be a Holiday gas station on the southeast corner of the intersection), turn left onto U.S. 10 toward Prescott. At the stoplight just across the bridge into Prescott, turn left again on U.S. 10 to the top of the hill. At the next stoplight, turn left onto Wisconsin 29/35 for 1.5 miles and turn left onto County Road F for another 1.5 miles. Turn right onto Pierce County Road MM for four blocks, turn right onto 1230<sup>th</sup> Street for two blocks and right again onto 694<sup>th</sup> Ave. Greg & Nancy can be found at the third house on the left. Be careful because 694<sup>th</sup> is a one-lane road and the drifts are plenty. Nearby parking will be at a premium, so carpool if you can.
