World's Oldest Running Car Fetches **\$4.62 Million**

The Dos-a-Dos (Back-to-Back) Steam Runabout was built in 1884 by George Bouton and Charles-Armand Trepardoux for French entrepreneur Count de Dion, who named it 'La Marquise' after his mother.

In 1887, with De Dion at the tiller, it won the world's first ever motor race (it was the only entrant to make the start line!) covering the 32km from the Pont de Neuilly in Paris to Versailles and back in one hour and 14 minutes (an average of 25.9km/h) and, according to contemporary reports, hitting a breathtaking 60km/h on the straights!

La Marquise has only had four owners, remaining in one family for 81 years, and has been restored twice, once by the Doriol family and again by British collector Tom Moore in the early 1990's. Since then, it has taken part in four London-to-Brighton runs and collected a double gold at the 1997 Pebble Beach d'Elegance in California.

Historic Austin Healey Sale

An Austin-Healey racing car involved in the worst crash in motor sport history is set to sell for nearly £1million. The disaster at the Le Mans 24-hour race in 1955 saw 84 people killed after the car was clipped by a Mercedes, which then flew into the crowd.

Scores of spectators were killed instantly as debris hurtled towards them at 150mph and fires erupted in the grandstand from the wreckage.

The French driver of the Mercedes, Pierre Levegh, also died in the crash, in north-west France.

After the tragedy, the Austin-Healey - driven by British racer Lance Macklin - was impounded by the French authorities before it was released to the British company the following year.

It was later sold to several private buyers before the current owner of the car - registration NOJ 393 - bought it for £155 in 1969.

Despite its macabre past and rusty state, motor sport enthusiasts are said to be willing to pay huge sums for it as it is a 'crucially historic landmark car'.

During the Le Mans race the green Austin-Healey was being driven by British racer Lance Macklin, who began well. As the first round of pit-stops loomed, Macklin swerved to avoid Mike Hawthorn's heavily braking D-type Jaguar and pulled out in front of French driver Pierre Levegh. The Austin-Healey had a rear end like a ramp and it was clipped by Levegh's Mercedes-Benz 300SLR, which flew into the spectators. The French driver and 84 fans were killed, 120 people were injured, and the whole incident was recorded on film.

Macklin escaped without injury but the disaster prompted major changes in how motor sport safety was implemented. The race continued despite the crash and it was eventually won by Mike Hawthorn.

Now, the Austin-Healey's anonymous owner has decided to sell it at auction after keeping it locked up for the past 42 years at a garage in the north of England.

MAHC Board OKs Recruiting Incentives**Free First Year Dues for New MAHC and National Members****By Greg Lauser**

The Minnesota Austin-Healey Club Board of Directors has developed an incentive program during 2012 for current members to use with Austin-Healey Club of America postcards created for recruiting new members. To complement AHCA's membership recruiting effort – which provides free membership the year people join AHCA for the first time – the board voted unanimously to offer free first year membership in MAHC at its meeting December 3, 2011.

Those joining AHCA and MAHC who have not been club members previously will receive all the benefits of both clubs free for the balance of the calendar year in which they sign up. To enjoy free memberships for that year, folks must join both clubs.

Incentives are not limited to new members. Current MAHC members who recruit the most new members during 2012 will be eligible to win one of five copies of the new Hemmings Encyclopedia of Collector Cars. It is a \$15 reference full of information about Donald Healey and other automotive pioneers, the cars Healey developed for our enjoyment, other car clubs and suppliers of use to auto buffs.

To make membership application easier, the national club produced cards that members can use for recruiting. Each member of the national club received one set of these cards in their 2011 AHCA Membership Directory. Additional copies of those cards are available from MAHC Membership Director Jim Kriz and National Delegate Greg Lauser.

The perforated card form (pictured) contains two postcards to be completed and mailed: one for the current member and a second for the new member application. In addition to facilitating the membership process, that card helps keep track of ownership changes for the sports cars. The owner simply sends his or her card into the national club, informing AHCA that a vehicle they owned is changing hands. At the time of the sale, the seller gives the new owner the added benefit of free membership with the second card – the membership application.

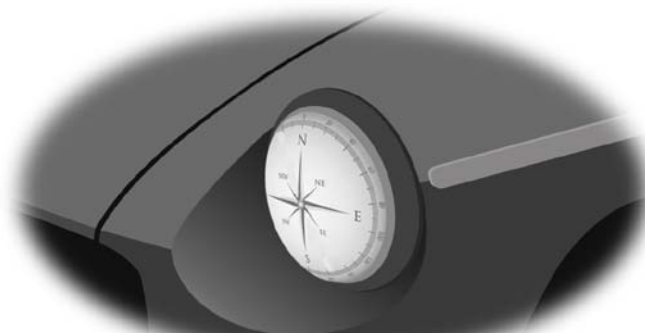
A second, stand-alone card is for current members to give people who stop them to talk about their sports car, or otherwise express interest in learning more about them and finding their own car. The cards are sized to be easily carried in Healey door slots and glove boxes, so they're readily available to members while driving their sports cars.
