Presidential Ponderings



Blitzkrig 2011

Two years ago, Jeff Lumbard, Jeff Johnk, Mike Manser, and I started the planning for this journey. Our goal was to see all the major car museum venues in Europe plus the "Battle of the Bulge" area... all in about a week! What we ended up with was a nine day, 2000 mile trip, through five countries (some multiple times) with six major car venues, a tour of a Maginot line bunker, visits to various Battle of the Bulge sites, and an evening in Amsterdam with Mike as our guide (he goes there frequently for some reason).

We flew to Amsterdam (arriving at 6:30AM Saturday local time or 11:30 PM Friday body time), immediately drove to Essen Germany and after arriving at the Essen Auto-Technica vintage/historic car show venue at 2:30 AM body time, spent seven hours at the venue. The show is the largest in Europe, and has 29 (yes 29) acres of display area. Mercedes of course has a large presence as do other vintage/historic auto dealers and parts suppliers (AH Spares, A Head for Healeys, etc), food vendors, etc. That evening, April 2nd, we had dinner outdoors at a local restaurant. That was the perfect end to a very busy day.

Upon waking Sunday AM, we drove to Malmedy Belgium (German tanks came through about five minutes into the Battle of the Bulge) and then drove to Stavelot... but it was closed... for a local festival. We then drove south, stopped at the site of the massacre of American troops by the Germans, skirted St. Vith, went through part of Luxemborg (looks like Wisconsin), and ended up in France at the Maginot line venue (www.maginot-hackenberg.com) with thirty minutes to spare. Had a great two plus hour tour of the tunnels (via train), the turrets, ammo areas, etc. Goes to show how great ideas don't always work out. We then drove to Rumbach, Germany. It is a town about the size of Afton, and was reputed to be the ancestral home to part of Jeff Johnk's family tree. We stayed at the only hotel in town (15 rooms) and visited with the owner who had been mayor for years and still handled the local church records... that go back to 1040 AD! She had never heard of Jeff's relatives... as Jeff told his mom by phone while enroute to our next venue, waking her at 5:30AM her time.

Our next stop was the French national motor museum in Mulhouse France. Most car folks refer to it as the Schlumph collection. Again, hundreds of cars to view from Bugatti Royale's to a tear-drop shaped unpainted aluminum micro car. Saw more Bugatti's than I ever thought existed. We also visited the French national train museum (five minutes away) and saw the only Bugatti designed passenger train, powered by four Royale twelve cylinder engines with the driver in a cupola on top of the passenger compartment.

Next stop was the Porsche museum in Stuttgart. They have the "first of this", the "only of that", the "prototype of ...", "the race winner of ...". Slightly mind bending. That evening we visited the Dinkel-Acher brew pub which shares a wall with the brewery. Good food, great beer.

Next day was the Mercedes museum. Way over the top with over five acres of displays. You start by taking an elevator to the seventh floor and walk down a spiral walkway to the ground floor. On the way we saw the first SLR on the only highspeed transporter (powered by a 300 SL engine), the Stirling Moss Mille-Miglia winner, a Popemobile, some breathtaking prewar MB touring cars, and hundreds of other cars... many you have seen in magazines.

We then drove to Munich and had dinner outdoors at the world's oldest continuously operating brewery, Weihenstephan, which has been brewing beer since 1040 AD. Next morning we visited the Audi museum at Ingolstadt.

The following day we drove to the Sinsheim Auto-Technica venue. It is part WW2 diorama (planes, tanks, other weapons), part amusement park, part state fair, part aircraft display, and part auto display. Most of our time was spent looking at the cars. Many Maybach's, Mercedes competition in the thirties, ship engines, a beast of a car named Brutus (it's on You tube). They also have airplanes that you can walk through on display on the roofs of the other buildings. We climbed the spiral stairs to the roof of the building, climbed another set to the rear entry door of both a Concorde and the Russian equivalent Tupelov supersonic and walked uphill to the cockpit area, at which point we were about 400 feet above the ground and could feel the planes sway a bit. After walking through a number of other planes we took off for Bastogne, arriving there late afternoon. We visited the woods defended by Easy Company of the 101st Airborne, as depicted in Band of Brothers. The trees were obviously different, but it was still a haunting place to be in the late afternoon. We visited a couple of other memorial sites, and had a nice quiet dinner in the town square. The next morning (Saturday), a number of war re-enactors showed up with vintage military vehicles. After checking them out, we drove north and finally saw Stavelot. While parked in the main square we noticed there was still confetti in the cobblestones from the celebration that had closed the town the week before.

Once on the road again we dropped the car at the Amsterdam airport, took the train into town, checked into our hotel, took a canal boat ride, visited Mike's favorite tavern, the Wildman, took a leisurely walk around the central city after dark and keeping in mind that "what happens in Amsterdam probably would not stay in Amsterdam", didn't do anything we wouldn't want to see in print. Then went back to Mike's favorite bar. The next morning was basically a get up, get ready to go, get to the airport, and get home.

It was a great 2000 mile journey, although gas was about \$9.80 per gallon! No driving problems other than a couple of detours we had to work around. GPS is great. Generally great food at reasonable prices. Absolutely great beer. Fantastic auto venues. Virtually everyone spoke enough English for us to get by without a problem. The autobahns were interesting. Speed limits varied based on how close you were to on ramps or towns, and on the three lane, rural sections, there was no speed limit at all. One white Porsche passed us like we were literally parked... and we were going 82 MPH!

If anyone would like to see some of what we saw, I'll be giving a copy of my photos and some short video clips on disks to the club should anyone want to get a better idea of what we saw on the trip.
