The Presidential Corner

What got you interested in British cars? I remember when I started looking around for my first car. I knew it had to be a ragtop but wasn't sure about much else. I was thinking about a full-size 65 Chevy - or maybe a 64 Cutlass. My Dad and I would go out and look at cars, and he'd say "No, that's not what you want." I didn't really understand how he knew what I wanted, especially when I didn't even know. After what seemed like an eternity, "the car" suddenly found me.

My Dad worked at a wholesale distributor that sold tires, batteries, lawn mowers and snow blowers. He got me a job at that place assembling snow blowers. One day, a coworker told us that his brother's 1964 MG Midget was available. The brother was not mechanically inclined, and the Midget was eating him alive. He had just paid to have the brakes redone, after he had topped off the master cylinder with 10W30! Now, there was some kind of problem with the oil pressure. I never gave it any thought before, but suddenly I'm wondering if he put the wrong juice in the crankcase too! There was no battery in the car, so we didn't even try to start it. It was British Racing Green and had a 1275 engine from a '67. So exotic! We agreed on \$350, which I recall thinking was the best deal ever!

We towed that car most of the way home, with a very excited 16 year old at the wheel. It was quite a distance - about 90 miles as I recall - and it was winter! We got to the Mankato warehouse, threw a battery in the car, and turned the key. She fired right up - and sounded fantastic. Oil pressure seemed pretty good at 40 pounds. Just a five mile trip left now. Piece of cake!

After three miles, the oil pressure was down to about five pounds. By the time I pulled my pride and joy into the driveway, it was "absolute zero"; and there was a hint of knock coming from under the bonnet. Today, I'm sure none of us would expect to get out of this story without spending a small fortune, but I was just a dumb kid with no money. I polished up the crank journals, put in new bearings and gaskets, and splurged on five or six lifters - as some of them were badly pitted. I think the total cost came to about \$65. That car continued to challenge me for the next two years with a broken axle shaft, a laygear with missing teeth, and every electrical problem imaginable. That little engine, however, never gave me a lick of trouble again.

FUSES

Lucas Glass Fuses come in a variety of sizes however their ratings are somewhat confusing. The Amperage on the fuse is **twice** that which the fuse will provide continuous protection.

For example, a 35 Amp Lucas fuse actually will protect a surge of 40 amps when the switch is thrown and will protect at 17.5 amps continuous operation. The 35 Amp rating is for the period after the surge until circuit demand is stabilized.

If you have to use an American glass fuse, use the chart:

Lucas Fuse Rating (British)	BUSS AGC Equivalent (American)
50	30
35	25
30	20
25	15
20	10
10	7.5
5	3

So for the purposes of fuse selection, have the appropriate Lucas type fuses on hand. However, if you have to use an American type fuse, one of approximately half the rating of the Lucas fuse is appropriate.

Another note: American glass fuses are slightly larger in diameter, which may have impact on the way they fit in your fuse block. The Jaguar E type has a fuse block in which American fuses will not reliably operate.


