The VP REPORT by Rod Richert

In last month's column I wrote about U.S. border control regulations in preparation for rendezvous in Pinawa, Manitoba. I promised to report on Canadian regulations regarding U.S. citizens with DUI's. The Canadian border services website answers email requests that contain no attachments, "profanity" or questions related to specific cases. I sent none of the former and thought that my reference to rumors (of entry denied to drivers with DUI's) was hypothetical enough as to not constitute the latter. I received an automated email acknowledging my request and that every effort would be made to respond within one Canadian business day. Many American business days later without a response, I can only conclude that they think I have a DUI conviction.

Information came from an unexpected source. I requested a map and travel guide from <travelmanitoba.com> (I love maps. For Pinawa I have a western states/provinces map and maps of both Ontario and Manitoba). Within is a list of commonly asked questions, one of which is "If I have a crimminal record will I be allowed to enter Canada?" Answer: "...all situations are reviewed of a case by case basis. For example, driving under the influence (DUI). It is strongly advised that visitors call the nearest Canadian Consulate in the U.S. prior to visiting Canada." The nearest office is Detroit at (313) 567-2340.

WHAT TO BRING TO PINAWA: A list of parts for long road trips might include: duct tape, points, condenser, v-belt, pregapped spark plugs, distributor cap, spare fuel pump, fuel filter, a tube of hand cleaner and rags.

WHAT NOT TO BRING TO PINAWA: Canadian customs prohibits the following items: radar detectors, mace, pepper spray and tear gas, switch blades, brass knuckles and potatoes. Limit your meat to 20 kg (44 lbs) and cash to \$10,000. <cbsa-asfc.cg.ca>

TECH TIP: by Ernie West Preparing for Spring

The number one thing, in my opinion, is insurance. Before you turn the key you should reactivate the policy. If you are like me, you probably dropped the liability part, and left only the comprehensive part active. You can just imagine the anguish you'll suffer if you go to the storage place and in your impatient haste, turn on the key and proceed to start the car. But because of a stuck intake valve there is very little vacuum to draw in the necessary air fuel mixture. But with persistent choking and pumping you finally get enough fuel into the cylinders to allow ignition. Then, holy moly, that stuck intake allows combustion to enter the intake manifold and the resultant explosion blows a big ball of flame all over the engine compartment, which rapidly migrates to the floor and that small pile of oil soaked oil dry. MAHC CLUB MEMBER MAKING CROSS-COUNTRY DRIVE BENEFITING THE MAKE-A-WISH FOUNDATION®

Starting June 19 at least one member of the Minnesota Austin-Healey Club will begin a 10-day cross-country drive in his classic 1967 Austin-Healey 3000 sports car to raise tax-deductible contributions to the Make-A-Wish Foundation[®]. Greg Lauser, who also is vice president for public relations with the Austin-Healey Club of America (AHCA), will start from his home near Prescott, Wis. He'll steer his vintage British sports car on a roundtrip of more than 5,300 miles raising funds while traveling to and from the club's annual Conclave gathering in San Diego. All Minnesota donations he receives will benefit the state chapter of the charity.

"The caravan is designed to promote involvement and fundraising across the continent by AHCA's regional clubs," Lauser said. "Our regional clubs and their members have supported philanthropy in their own areas for several years. This national effort builds on that history."

He said the goal is to help children facing life-threatening conditions make their one true wish come true through their local Make-A-Wish offices. He's also trying to recruit other Minnesota and national club members to make the drive. Lauser said the clubs' national "Cross Country Caravan for Kids" is flexible so those who cannot make the entire trip can drive just as far as they wish.

"With gas prices being what they are now and will be this summer, I understand people's hesitation," he said. "Healeys were made between 1952 and 1976 when miles-per-gallon weren't a concern, so that's a factor." He said his vehicle gets 20-22 mpg on the highway.

His first travel day will take him down the Mississippi River to Savanna, III., where he'll be met for dinner by members of the Midwest Austin-Healey Club from the Chicago area. The next day he'll drive to the St. Louis area, where he'll join other national club members who are making the transcontinental drive.

At least one other AHCA member is using Bennington, Vt. to start his drive June 14. Other drivers and club officers will start June 18 from Charlotte, N.C. From St. Louis westward, they'll travel together to Southern California.

Lauser and other drivers will rendezvous with members of 46 regional Austin-Healey clubs in the United States and Canada who have raised (or will be raising) funds to benefit their local Make-A-Wish chapters. Along the way, they anticipate they'll be joined by other club members for the cross-country drive.

"AHCA selected the Make-A-Wish Foundation for its first national fundraising initiative because regional Make-A-Wish chapters make it possible for members of AHCA's regional clubs to help grant wishes in their local area," Lauser said. "That keeps the focus on funding for deserving youngsters in each club's backyard."

The Make-A-Wish Foundation was started in 1980 by family and friends of a 7-year-old Phoenix boy named Chris, who had leukemia. He dreamed of being a police officer. His family, friends and the Arizona Highway Patrol made his wish come true as "officer of the day" just four days before he passed away. Chris' mother and those who helped grant his wish created the foundation in his memory, enabling his legacy to live on. Since then, more than 161,000 wishes have been granted to children facing life-threatening medical conditions.

"The clubs hope to fund as many wishes as possible across North America through the generosity of regional club members and those who support their fundraising ideas and desire to help some very special children," Lauser said. He bought and began restoring his first 3000 in 1991 and has owned his current vehicle since 2001. He was president of the local club in 2005.


