TWO IMPORTANT PIES

At April's PIE, Byron Peterson talked at length about the MAHC's responsibility in maintaining our status as a non-profit corporation. In short, this provides considerable legal shelter from individual (officers') liability. The discussion was prompted by an article by Greg Lemon of the Flatwater Austin-Healey Club published in the March 2009 Healey Marque pages 26 and 27. Please read this and Gary Ronning's synopsis on page 4 of this month's Enthusiast. The MAHC Board is stepping up its efforts to act more like a corporation to strengthen the Club's legal standing.

Editor-at-large for European Car Magazine and author of the MOTOR OIL FOR THE CAR GUYS SOUL series, Kevin Clemens gave a short talk and signed books at March's PIE, Kevin will be the featured speaker at next month's Rendezvous in Ashland. A weakness in our bylaws is that the board isn't required to meet. Changing this should be considered. We also need to elect a Chairman of the Board. Calling the meetings will be one responsibility of this office.

It was decided that next month's PIE, May 6, 2009 will also include a Board meeting. Notice is hereby given.

Insurance and Incorporation

Recently the Austin Healey Club of America (AHCA) had a descriptive article in the *Healey Marque* regarding Insurance and Incorporation, as pertaining to our local clubs. It spelled out the details of insurance coverage and the advantages of incorporation. This was a wake-up call for checking the status of our Minnesota Austin Healey Club (MAHC), especially because we do sponsor many driving events yearly.

In 2001 the MAHC hosted the Austin Healey Conclave for the national club (AHCA). People and cars from around the country came to Grand Rapids, Minnesota to enjoy our hospitality. This event prompted our local club to incorporate, to protect our local club and its officers from personal liability at this major national gathering. The legal work was graciously done by our own longtime member, Healey owner, and Attorney, Byron Peterson.

Our recent discussion has uncovered some lack of activity on behalf of the MAHC. We were reminded that the club is required to renew the Non-profit Corporation status each year with the State of Minnesota. Treasurer(and CPA) Jim Klein and Byron looked into the matter, and we now have our status back in order. Thanks to those fellows for their expertise and time spent.

At the PIE meeting on April 1, Byron made some suggestions to keep the MAHC Board of Directors members aware that the corporate status needs to be renewed annually. The Chairman of the Board should call a meeting at least once per year. Ideally they should meet in December after the events for the coming year are planned and ratify those events. Minutes of those meetings should be recorded to prove that the Board has had meetings (a requirement of the State of MN). Also, they should schedule meetings when other important issues arise – again taking minutes. Refer to our Bylaws for details. In addition, Greg Lauser stated that a Club Officer or Board Member should sign any contracts into which the club enters. New members to the Board of Directors need to be aware of the details required to keep our local club healthy, as well as enjoyable.


