Come and enjoy refreshments and/or food with the friendly club members, catch up on news & events, and discuss cars & restorations.



Spline Tech By Steve Rixen



Beyond Worn Splines

Those who have splined hubs fight a continual battle against wear. This battle was lost, as well as the knock-off and the hub of the wheel, when the brakes were applied. Then there was a sound which could be described as the zipper on a giant's fly,

Be aware the splines on the wheel and hub need to be cleaned of grease and dirt and looked at with a critical eye annually. **Now would be a good time**, since Spring doesn't seem to be arriving. When splines are new they are triangular, "A" shaped with an even, flat surface on the spline top and in the bottom area between the splines.

Look for splines which are thinned to an "A" which is sharp at the top. The sides of the splines wear until the flat surface at the top has disappeared. If the splines are worn sharp, they can cut your fingers. The splines in the wheel hub need be inspected, and they are usually longer. Being longer you need to check for wear in the middle of the splines. Use a bright light from the far side of the wheel and look down the length of the spline. Inspect for a shape which the spline is leaning or worn offset, the ones shown above being an extreme example.

If your car's splines have minimal wear, apply grease to the threads and splined areas (but not to the coned area of the hubs), and install the wheels and knock off. How tight? Strike until the knock off barely moves when struck soundly with your hammer.

How worn is worn? If there is no flat surface on the top of the spline you should start a new wheel and hub fund. If the spline is worn to an uneven lean, it is past time to get new ones. If your hubs are worn, your wheel splines are most likely worn as well. Replace wheels and hubs at the same time. Putting worn wheels on new hubs wears them quickly as the splines do not mate evenly.

How much will it cost? More than you want to spend, but imagine what life is like on 3 wheels. If it has ever happened to you, you never forget it - and never want to repeat it.

Pikes Peak Hill Climb Car & Driver




Historical Highlights






Create History at Conclave 2011 in Colorado Springs




a special fundraiser for the public library near the park. Healey owners and the public may cast as many ballots as they wish for the People's Choice Award.




