

Hydraulic Tech Tips

The worst thing about the Austin Healey brake (and hydraulic clutch) system is the amount of care and work it takes to keep it operating correctly.

The brake master cylinders, calipers, wheel cylinders, and clutch slave cylinders have internal components made of gum rubber parts. These parts require the use of DOT 4 fluid to have any longevity. I have seen many Healey and early MG brake systems which have been serviced incorrectly with DOT 3 brake fluid, shortly turn the gum rubber seals and boots into just gum.

DOT 5 or Silicone Brake Fluid is an option but seems to seep out past even new seals when the weather is cold, which is about half the time here in Minnesota.

For that reason, Moss Motors says the warranty on new brake and clutch cylinders is void if Silicone brake fluid is used. I have worked with systems serviced with silicone fluid and have seen no degradation of the seals with it. Most sources say that starting with a completely empty system with new or freshly overhauled components would be best if switching to silicone.

Brake fluid has a tendency to absorb moisture; and over a short period of time, it deposits it in and corrodes the brake cylinders. This corrosion attacks the aluminum or iron the cylinder is made of and pits it. Once pitted the cylinder may be repaired by honing the cylinder and replacing the seal. Most times the corrosion is so extensive, replacement of the component(s) is required.


Better than repair and replacement of the components, the brake fluid should be flushed out every couple of years. This involves using the turkey baster to suck out as much of the fluid in the reservoir as possible - maybe agitating the scum on the bottom to get the crud out - and replacing it with fresh fluid. Then go to each wheel/slave cylinder and bleed fluid until it is clear. Remember it doesn't take long to drain the reservoir, but then you have air in the system with spongy brakes. A willing spousal unit comes in handy, as well as having at least a fresh quart of your selected brake fluid on hand.

Keeping moisture out of your hydraulic systems is also desirable. To this end, your brake reservoir should be sealed from too much air exchange. Moss Motors has a new seal available for the Big Healey reservoir, part number 582-505, which they say limits this. If you go to the Moss Website and enter the part number in the search box and then click on the MORE INFO hot spot you will find additional information about the seal which is not cheap but it is effective.

The seal not only keeps air out but it keeps brake fluid in. The paint under and around the reservoir on my Healey has suffered from years of brake fluid seeping out from cap. (Did I mention DOT 4 is an excellent paint stripper?) I installed the new \$10 seal prior to my driving to Black Hawk Farms for the Midwest AHC track day. For the first time ever my reservoir exterior was dry then and remains to this writing. A picture of the new seal is below, in the cap and by itself.



By the way, the www.mossmotors.com/ website has many technical articles, blogs, and Youtube videos (Moss TV) which are a great source of information to the novice (as well as the professional) about British car maintenance and repair.

InterMarque Report

Summary of Osseo City Council Meeting:

I attended the first council meeting on behalf of InterMarque and more or less re-introduced the InterMarque to the council. Also spent a few minutes talking about the success of last year's Spring Kick Off. I again thanked them for their support and spoke to them about what we have (so far) planned for changes to the 2013 event. Next year, the immediate changes being made would be for the way we marshall cars into the event. Better signage, maps and volunteers with vests will be used to guide vehicles in. I also said we would like to work with the Osseo entertainment committee to better co-ordinate what events would be taking place and what time they would take place. Also it would be nice to have a contact who would be available for questions or problems that might come up.

The council had no comments at this time as to changes they would like in our event. One of the council members did ask for a one on one meeting with him. I have not yet had the meeting but plan on contacting him within a week to get together.

Summary of InterMarque Council Meeting:

On Saturday the 13th we had an InterMarque council meeting on what happened at the Osseo City Council meeting as well as what general improvements might be made for the next event. One thing that came up was the "Golden Ticket" parking. The gist of it was, why keep the limit at seven (7) cars when we have a lot more room. This was a good point, as the seven (7) car limit was set at Como, where the room was limited. We decided that at next year's event, the limit would be opened up to more cars. What we can do is see how many spaces we had last year, as well as how many clubs participated - and divide them up. More to come on that.

There was also some discussion about the InterMarque participating more in a couple of existing car shows - Brit Fest for one. It was decided that if the InterMarque were to lend its name to the show, it would have to be open to all Marques of cars. The MG group will discuss it further at their next meeting as to which way they would like to go.

Also, the Royal British show was looking for assistance. Next year, plans are to move the show to the Jaguar Dealership. They would make room for the show and even offer some indoor space to hold specialty cars. The same rules would apply. If the InterMarque were to lend its name/support to the show, it would have to represent all Marques within the InterMarque organization.





