# MAHC Board of Directors Acts On Three Motions at July Meeting

The four members of the MAHC Board of Directors present at its July 10 meeting voted unanimously on three proposals affecting ongoing club operations.

First, since a small minority of club members regularly volunteer to uphold MAHC's club-wide commitment to the Adopt-A-Highway civic project, board members approved paying for participants' meals at club expense the day of scheduled pickups. The board stipulated that the club pay for no alcoholic beverages to eliminate possible club liability, if such beverages are consumed.

Second, in years when MAHC elects a new National Delegate, the club will pay the transportation, meal and lodging costs for the retiring delegate and delegate-designate that are not covered by the Austin-Healey Club of America, so both may attend AHCA's November Delegates meeting. Board members believe doing so will allow the retiring delegate to introduce his or her successor while providing continuity in club representation. (Currently, AHCA pays up \$150 of transportation costs and 25 percent of lodging expense at the designated meeting site for each club's National Delegate. The remainder of delegate expense is paid by MAHC. AHCA provides no reimbursement for persons designated to become National Delegates.)

Third, at this time MAHC will neither solicit nor accept advertising from non-members or commercial businesses for its newsletter, web site or other online communications. It was board consensus that the investment in time and effort required to develop advertising policies, procedures, specifications and conduct online updating services could not be justified for the amount of revenue that might be generated

#### Waumandee Hillclimb Weekend: September 2013

This, the second running of the event, got its kick-off in Alma, Wisconsin, at 5PM Friday evening with a line-up of cars on 2<sup>nd</sup> Street in front of the Castlerock Museum. Led by Tom Hazen, the group headed up County E nine miles to Waumandee for a preview drive up Blank Hill Road, Saturday's two-and-a-half mile course. Then we proceeded along the route drivers would be traveling to the Starting Line. The convoy's destination was Suncrest Gardens Farm for brick oven-baked Pizza with New Glarus Spotted Cow Beer.

Saturday morning activities began with the mandatory drivers meeting. The weather was beginning to look like a rerun of last year – grey clouds, brisk winds, and cool temp. The forecast had promised a partly cloudy day of sunshine and 60s. This ultimately panned out just after lunch break. First car was out of the Gate and headed to the Start at 9:25. The course had been extended a bit giving the drivers a nice little straightaway before the Finish. Those that drove through until 5PM made seven charges up the hill with times ranging from 3:57 to 2:35. About the 3:57, Andy Lindberg said that he was certain the rules were "to slow down and wave to the corner workers".

By 5:30 the course had been dismantled and cleaned up; and sixty hungry people had gathered at the Waumandee House for a country fried chicken buffet dinner, awards, and the opportunity to rehash the day's excitement. After a few hours the group began to disperse. On Sunday morning some gathered at the Pier 4 Café for breakfast and then a drive to Elmer's Auto & Toy Museum which sits atop the highest point in the area – Eagles Bluff. For those driving home the day was splendid. The tops were down to enjoy the sunshine, the warm temp, and the delightful southwestern Wisconsin terrain.

In all, nearly 100 people descended on the Waumandee area to drive, spectate, or work the Saturday event sponsored by the Minnesota Austin Healey Club - organized and captained by Sir Thomas Hazen. Many were from the Metro area, but some came from Milwaukee and Rockford. Safety ruled the day with no incidents. The overall running of the course all day by the 37 participants yielded only five penalty points (hitting a cone in one of the ten chicanes) -- very clean indeed!

And so, the 2013 Waumandee Hillclimb is history; and it was a very good chapter.

## Lucky John - by John Sprinzel

#### A Book Review

I will start by making a statement that is often used in book reviews, "If there is one book that every car enthusiast should have on their shelf".... I truly feel this is the case with Lucky John, an autobiography about John Sprinzel. The book is incredible, filled with such vivid detail and it is expressed beautifully to the point where you feel like you are actually there living every experience with him.

Sprinzel takes you on a remarkable journey of his life, starting out in Germany where he was born in 1930. He continues on into his time of growing up in England and later when he was a part of the Royal Air Force. While in the R.A.F. Sprinzel found himself involved with motorcycles-first by fixing them up so they would be road worthy and then eventually racing them on base. This became his stepping-stone and first path of many through the world of motorsports during a time when cars, tracks, drivers, and other people involved, were making history and heroes were being born.

Sprinzel's first motorcar race was the RAC International Rally of Great Britain with his co-worker Lutz Arnstein. The car he used was an Austin A30, which belonged to his mother. After doing surprisingly well in his first rally, he noticed that a large sum of the other rally cars were TR2s and decided to get a Triumph himself. This car was not only used for rallies, but for hill climbs, gymkhanas, and sprints. He also joined the Harrow Car Club where he met Stirling Moss (and eventually ended up dating his sister, Pat Moss). I'm sure everyone will find his rally stories highly entertaining. My personal favorite tale was the Monte Carlo Rally. I will resist giving details because that will spoil your joy of reading it for yourself, but I am laughing even as I think of it. The book also features tales from The RAC Rally, The Alpine Rally, The Liege-Rome-Liege, The East African Safari, The Tulip Rally, The Tour de France, The London-Sydney Marathon, and The London to Mexico World Cup Rally (which Sprinzel also helped to organize). Each rally chapter contains great stories from the events, but as a huge bonus there are also beautiful period Rally pictures. As a photographer I could go on at length about how wonderful the pictures are, but will just state the book to me is worth the price of admission just for the photos.

Of course readers also get inside knowledge about Sprinzel's time at Speedwell and the time he spent with the Healeys (the people and the cars). The stories from road circuit races like Nurburgring, Monza, and Sebring are equally as enjoyable.


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
