# Austin-Healey 70th Anniversary Celebration of the 1952 Earls Court Motor Show



As of the end of May, over 500 guests had already registered for Enclave 2022, to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the Marque in the scenic Pocono Mountains of Pennsylvania. Enclave 2022 is only three months away, and we have guests from 32 different states, Canada, the UK, and as far away as Hong Kong.

At Enclave 2022 you will experience the four-county region famous for its resorts, natural scenic beauty, 150 lakes including Lake Wallenpaupack, and quaint, historic towns. We are fortunate to have a commitment from Blair Harber to bring not only the first production Austin-Healey (#138031), but also two pre-production cars: AHX12 and AHX14. # Steve Rixen's Race Adventure: Update, Brainerd International Raceway

After having overheating problems at the Harvey West Memorial Classic at Brainerd International Raceway (BIR), I brought the car home to clean the cooling system.

I drained the system, refilled it with water, used some radiator and cooling flush additive from the automotive chemicals aisle of the parts store, and (following the label directions) ran the engine as directed. **Hint**: Use a box fan to blow air through the grill.

Then I removed the radiator to flush both directions, removed the water pump and thermostat, and using an old clothes washer hose with an end cut off, I fed it into the block as far as possible and in as many places and angles as possible, and then flushed the rust and detritus out of the block. I also flushed into the head at the heater feed point.

I continued to flush until the water ran clear, replaced/installed the water pump, hoses, thermostat or restrictor, and radiator. I refilled with distilled water and antifreeze/water/wetter of choice. Did a test drive.

After all this I loaded the car for the trip to the Midsummer Classic at BIR. The car ran cool from the first practice session through the weekend. I ran every lap available to my run group and lowered my lap times to 2:01+ from the 2:09+ my first run in May and 2:04+ the last run in May.

I'm improving by finding my braking, turn-in and apex points, and learning to trust the car and my capabilities, especially when in traffic and unable to quite approach the corner as I wanted to. Very Fun!

Kim and my nearly 16-year-old granddaughter, Elena, made the trip to BIR as my crew. Gary and Nancy Oster with their tri-carb roadster and Gary and Barb Ronning with their Z3 showed up early Saturday morning to watch the cars run and do track touring during the noon hour. Elena rode with Gary O during the touring period and was very enthusiastic about the experience.

We'll see about the Jack Pine Sprints, Labor Day Weekend, but no matter what it should be fun!

### MAHC/AHCA (local and national) members:

For MAHC/AHCA members renewals be different, but hopefully easier. You will no longer receive paper renewal invoices.

The Austin Healey Club of America (our governing organization) implemented a new and powerful internet tool for managing clubs and associations called ClubExpress (CE). As part of that program, you will have a new username and password.

You should have already received an email from the Austin Healey Club of America with your new username and a temporary password, and another telling you to go to the website to renew your membership. Below are detailed instructions:

- 6. On the Payments screen you can choose whether to pay with a credit card online or by mailing in a check.
