UPCOMING EVENTS

Intermarque Spring Kick Off Jay Jaycobson reported there are 10 slots for Healeys. The featured cars this year are racecars (although many may be a Road America racing that weekend.) As usual, the event will take over downtown Osseo. Last year more than 300 cars were there. The event is for all old foreign cars. Show up at 9:00 AM. They are going to do a Tech Session where cars can be checked and certified them as safe to race for the year. This year some antique motorcycles are coming.

Road America is also a nice trip. Visitors "have to" go to the Thorpedo, a café that's been there since the 40s. It's on the north side of the street. Cheese is on the south side. May 18-21. Many of the cars are faster than when they were new. They have a Concours afterwards, which requires dressing up.

Rendezvous will be June 8-10 in Ashland WI. This year it is sponsored by the Triumph Club. Car clubs from Winnipeg, Thunder Bay, and all the Minnesota clubs are invited.

MAHC sponsored Track Day will be June 24 and Aug 4. It's a low-key track day at Dakotah County Technical College, which has a small one-mile racing track used for training police, truck drivers, etc. One car is on the track at a time, doing two laps. Rosemount. Each car can get 5-7 runs if they want. Not like a Metropolitan Sports Club event; it's more like a party with cars. John asked if anyone is interested in doing food, but with no responses he mentioned doing box lunches.

Clear, crisp midsummer dawn in western North Dakota, I-94 sweeps across the high plains. Westward bound my lime-green 1967 Ford Galaxy two-door Fastback, long and lean. Four guys and a trunkful of backpacks headed for the East Rosebud trail in the Beartooth Mountains. I was at the wheel, having slept remarkably well between Fargo and Mandan, where we gassed up. A keen edge feeling came with the low sun lighting the first truly western landscape, and I followed the car's shadow dead straight toward the distant vanishing point. Mark and Greg were asleep in the back seat; Jim rode shotgun.

The Galaxie 500 two-door Fastback evolved to cruise the new freeway system. The 390 CID engine with a two-barrel carb came up to speed reasonably well and loped along happily at Interstate speeds—it had long legs and got decent mileage for a big block. The sun comes up early on those long northern summer days. At 5:00 a.m. on that Saturday morning, the Peterbuilts and Kenworths sat in the truck stops and rest areas. Farmers, crops in the field, were still in bed or drinking coffee and reading the paper.

I gazed down the empty road, gave the gas pedal the slightest pressure and glanced down to see the red needle swing slowly across the horizontal line of numbers past 75. A little more pressure moved it across the 80 mark, and I glanced over at Jim. I added throttle and the car seemed to tighten and slightly lift between 90 and 100. I kind of sensed Jim's level of awareness was also becoming elevated—as was mine. By this time my foot was on the floor and the needle moved beyond the 110 mark. At this end of the 60's-style gauge the actual speed indicated was pretty vague, but I wasn't paying much attention to that as I was focused on the general instability of the car and maintaining direction. The car now felt loose and on the verge of control, so I lifted my foot.

Jim relaxed and took his hand off the dashboard as the car settled into its familiar cruise mode. By this time Mark and Greg were conscious, and we talked about getting gas and breakfast in Glendive. The little old ladies at the truck stop there made killer breakfast burritos.

On Friday the Madeline Island trip by ferry will leave at <u>9.am</u>.


