I slept in the ditch until rescued by a family who drove me to Miles City. I arranged for a tow expecting the worst. Much to my surprise, the problem turned out to be the rotor. I have no idea how the mechanic knew what the issue was or how they had access to a part. I don't expect there were many Healeys in Montana. This was the same trip I had two flat tires within ten miles while driving through South Dakota on the way to Yellowstone. Did I mention that my speedometer cable also broke on that trip? Talk about an ill-fated adventure.

Recently I had a tune-up; points, plugs, and condenser. Normally I can do this servicing on my own, but needed exhaust repair so sought the aid of Bob Baas in Alexandria. He does old cars and is highly regarded. I furnished the parts form Moss. and Bob did the installation. Bob Noted that the base plate on the point set did not fit in the distributor without grinding out part of the plate to accommodate a screw in the distributor. I thought I would mention it in case anybody had a similar issue.

North Star BMW CCA: Tire Rack Street Survival Experience

The first week of February this year wasn't great for a Winter Driving School, so the North Star BMW Club pivoted to make the event a precision driving event for the young people (15+ with a Driver's Permit and parental waiver or Licensed driver to 22).

Last year Kim and I were sponsors for my permitted granddaughter to take the course driving her mother's Chevy SUV. Not an exciting event with a big box on wheels and Automatic Skid Control, but at least it was wintery.

This year I wanted her to have more involved experience in control and handling by driving my 2006 Civic 5-speed with no more driving aid than ABS braking. Friday, she drove to Hudson in her SUV, where Kim and I met her. Kim drove the SUV back to Shoreview ,and Elena and I went off for three hours practice driving with the manual transmission.

Saturday morning, she drove us to DCTC precision driving instruction facility for our 8:00 AM check-in with 27 other young drivers, all in their high school years, and most having no experience driving as they would do the rest of the day.

The day started with basic handling classroom instruction for all 28 students, then half went out to drive on course for half an hour, and the other half had another period of instruction. So the day went, except for a provided lunch break, rotating groups, half on track and half in class. When the students came in, the conversation was about speed through the slalom portion of the course, how many cones they collected on the accident-avoidance lanes, how the car felt when braking half on asphalt, half on gravel, and experiencing some other actions.

At the end of the day the students were tired, happy, and in possession of a certificate of completion from the North Star BMW Club and sponsoring Tire Rack. Are you sorry that you missed this event? The BMW and Audi Clubs have other "Adult" Winter and Precision Driving classes during the year, most of which are not limited to young drivers. They are available to licensed drivers 16 to 18 with a parental waiver, and from 18 to 105 by just signing up.
