Road America/Conclave 2024

September RoadAmerica Races: Jeff Lumbard reported that very expensive amazing '56
Sebring racecar will be there. The Wisconsin Healey club is now going to rent five big round
tables that each seat 8 people and 30 chairs for the tents for \$370. The Wisconsin club is not
doing anything else for RoadAmerica, because they're busy with Conclave.

If you're going to RoadAmerica in September, you can register for the Healey Challenge, which allows you to bring your streetcar into the racetrack. Dave Herreid has done it. You get a pass to get your car into the paddock and to park it in the parking area close to our tent. It's in the winner's circle area. There's a banquet Saturday night. Dave also signed up for a tour. \$270 for two.

Report from Jack Pine Sprints at Road America by Eileen Wetzel

The Jack Pine Sprints at BIR were enjoyed by MAHC members Rich and Liz Stadther, Jim Koktavy and Jaime Horner, and Gary and Eileen Wetzel on Saturday and Sunday, August 24th and 25th. MAHC guests Jeff Johnk, Brock Thorson, and his brother Craig also joined us Saturday. We were joined by several family and friends as well.



We paddocked on Friday afternoon and made our way to the VSCR dinner, where we congregate with our VSCR family. It was great to greet friends we hadn't seen for a long while. We had fine camaraderie.

Saturday morning was beautiful with not a cloud in the sky. A light breeze kept insects at bay. It was a very special day, because Jim Koktavy would be taking his maiden race drive in his newly acquired race car, 28. When we arrived at the track at 7:30 a.m., we were met by Jeff Johnk, who

had driven up that morning. As the previous owner of 28, he was there to crew and support Jim as he got acclimated to his new car. Jim was unsure how Jeff would feel about the subtle changes he had made to its appearance, which was very tastefully done. Jeff was very pleased with the outcome as well.

We had three scheduled sessions each day: practice, qualifier, and race. No lap times were posted for the practices, but in the qualifier for closed wheel, Eileen Wetzel had best lap time of 1:54.406, Jim Koktavy 1:54.514,

and Jaime Horner 1:57.780. In the race: Eileen 1:54.266, Jim 1:54.475, and Jaime 1:56.103. It was eventful, as we all took turns spinning out at various corners. For open wheel class, Rich had a qualifier of 1:51.666, but only did four laps. In his race, he did 9 of 12 laps with the best a 1:52.086. It was a fun day racing followed by dinner, camaraderie, and a lot of laughter.

Sunday started out overcast, but was hot and sticky. It seemed to affect the drivers as there were more incidents on track that required clean up. Our practice session was canceled due to clean up required after the session preceding ours. Qualifying, Rich got all ten laps in with a best time of 1:51.922. Closed wheel was: Jim 1:52.074, Jaime 1:52.414, and Eileen 1:54.194. It was clear that novices Jim and Jaime were getting very comfortable with their cars and the track. The race results were: Rich finishing all laps with a best time of 1:51.873. His session was not without incident as one car blew its engine and another hit the oil, which caused it to end up into a wall. Fortunately, no one was injured. Closed wheel race results were: Jaime 1:53.897, Jim 1:53.958, Eileen DNF as her car was acting up and she retired early.

It was a great weekend of racing and camaraderie. All I can say is "I wonder what the conversation was like between Jim and Jaime on the way home as their competition was so close!" I know they were both happy with their and their cars performances.

Healey Advice and Help Needed by Curt Carlson

I'm still looking for a couple of hours of help from a couple of people!

Recently, I was contacted by the daughter of a former Minnesota Austin Healey Club member from the 1990s. Her father has passed away, and she and her husband were looking for ways to trust and enjoy the '64 BJ7 that he had left for her. Although they do have mechanical abilities, they don't have familiarity with British cars or the Healey specifically. She wants to be able to enjoy the car and trust it for trips around the lakes and maybe out to Stillwater every once in a while. She lives in South Minneapolis. I looked at it last week and talked it over with her. She recounted learning with her dad how to drive a stick shift and taking the car on picnics and family drives. It is clear that the car means a lot to her, and it's a direct connection to her dad.

The car is a very strong driver. Brakes feel good and the master cylinder was recently rebuilt. The steering feels tight and strong. Tires are new and hold air. Suspension feels good. The doors open and close easily without lifting or slamming. The engine starts and runs without any electrical issues or fuel leaks, and the car drives well and has a working overdrive. From what I can tell, it needs a new head gasket, because there is currently weeping of both oil and coolant down the side of the engine, and she commented on cooling issues at stop lights and slow traffic conditions.

I'm guessing that it would need a flush of all fluids, water-wetter in the coolant, and the addition of a pusher electric radiator fan in front, as well as the head gasket.

I'm willing to help with a volunteer donation of my time and effort. Is anyone willing to pitchin? I'm looking for a couple of good 'ol retired guys who are willing to put in an hour or two to epitomize the true essence and mission of the Minnesota Austin Healey Club. Their budget is very tight. She understands that there are commercial repair options available. But they are financially out of reach, and she is reaching out to the Healey Club for help. Who's with me? '61 Bugeye Sprite \$14,000

I've owned my 1961 Bugeye Sprite since 1996. I've decided to sell it after 28 years because I have other British vehicles, and it's time to move the car to someone who will enjoy it like I did when I first got it. The car is stock and in very good condition. Like most Bugeyes, it gets a lot of attention at car shows.

It's red with a black interior. Original stock 948 cc inline-four engine, lap belts, a four-speed manual transmission, a soft top frame and fabric (with a small hole on the top of the rib corner), sliding-window side curtains.
