His dad had a Ford dealership, and so Dave grew up with American cars, but doesn't know a lot about British ones.

- Drive Healey to events; best way to attract new members.
- The club is going to need new board members this year.
- MAHC got a certificate of donation from the Healey Museum in Europe.

Delegate's Report

- Eileen has been put on a special committee to look at retention. Our members are aging and dying; some can no longer get in and out of the car. Why aren't we getting new younger members? Inhibitors: big Healey pricing, relatively few young people can drive a manual shift, today's adults remember cars from the 1980s vs. the vintage cars we drive, cars are increasingly seen as commodities, the current styling is by laws of physics. How can we promote our marque, because then the value stays up. Was worth \$80K, now \$50K. Ideas to attract new members:
 - o Emphasize styling of cars.
 - o Doing programs at schools.
 - o Making our cars available for parades and homecoming.
 - o Making our cars available to ad agencies.
 - o Regional events. Would someone write a summary of Rendezvous.
 - o Promote drivability and maintainability of Big Healeys.
 - Expose the cars and let others see them.
 - Offering participation awards for local clubs.
 - o National has redone the website to make it more user-friendly.
 - o Doing more videos and zoom tech sessions.
- Curt shows the chart of membership. Peaked in 2001-2002, about 30-35 years after the last
 Healey rolled off the assembly line. We were 45 years old when we could afford to buy a car
 and join the club and had the time. Amery also helped the membership peak.
- Eileen got an email about an Ice Cream Social challenge from an individual, suggesting going out in your car for ice cream and publishing a picture.



Back in a 3000

It started with a call from Jean Caron of Winnipeg on a cold, latefall day in 2024. A gal from Minneapolis had phoned to ask if she could somehow get a ride for her dad in a Healey. After explaining that he lived in Canada, that would be difficult. Jean connected with me and passed her contact info, and I called her. It seems her dad once owned a Healey. I reached Brad, and we



made some plans to get him back in the seat of a Healey on a good weather day during the upcoming summer. That day came for Brad on July 17. A perfect Healey day was in the forecast—75





I picked Brad up at 10:30 at his Minnetonka home. There was a bit of getting acquainted conversation in the driveway and listening to a few Healey stories from him and his wife Deb. After taking a few photos, we were off for a few hours. Already being on the west side of town, we took to the roads out there — Minnetonka Blvd to Navarre, Hwy 15 to Watertown, then 20 to 26 to 92 into Lyndale. A lunch stop at the Ox Yoke Inn and then onto County 6 to 101 and back to his home. In total Brad spent over 80 miles back on the road in a Healey.

During our drive, but mostly at lunch, I heard stories about Brad and his car. Quite a few sounded like my Healey stories. He was based on a Navy destroyer in Charleston when he bought a 1962 3000, colored in many shades of primer, for \$500. By his own admission it was just a fun driving car for a young kid. He had no cares or concerns.

Through the years of ownership, he rebuilt the engine and transmission, did some bodywork and repainted in a dark blue. He sold the car in 1982 to someone in the Twin Cities area. His was the usual scenario of "new family" and a two-seat British sports car ain't going to make it. He tells of the day he sold it: two guys responded to his want ad and arrived at his house at the same time. They nearly had a fist fight over who would buy the car. (Does this sound familiar to anyone who may have bought a blue Healey in the early 80s?)

There are some things I took away from this very delightful day I spent with Brad. People who have owned Healeys, especially in their young formative years, have their stories and memories. Even the bad memories are now fond recalls. That's part of a British sports car; they come with it. A Healey can actually become connected to your psyche. Here was a man who sold his car over 40 years ago, and he still smiles with the thoughts of his dozen years with it.

The following is from the August 1987 issue of the Minnesota Austin Healey Club newsletter. Dan Powell was the editor at the time.
